**Sacrament of Marriage:** Arrangements for the Sacrament of Marriage must be made at least 6 months before the marriage date. It is necessary to be a registered parishioner to schedule.

## St. James Parish — Fourth Sunday of Lent

## From the desk of Fr. Paul Cygan

Something fascinating is happening in our country. Have you noticed it? There is a very current surge of religious fervor throughout our country. The movie Jesus Revolution outperformed Marvel's new release Ant-Man Quantumania in the box office by nearly ten million dollars! Not to mention the religious revival that took place in Asbury! Throughout most of February, college students led a 24/7 praise and worship revival! Something amazing is happening! And we are here for it!

Two weeks ago, we read from Matthew's account of the Transfiguration. Jesus led Peter, James and John up the mountain of Tabor and then Jesus' clothes shone bright as the sun, and Moses and Elijah appeared by his side representing the law and the prophets. When the three disciples saw this amazing spectacle, they were in awe. Peter did not want this amazing event to end and wanted to build tents to set camp there for who knows for how long. Maybe indefinitely! To which God the Father speaks and says, "This is my beloved Son, listen to him."

I mention this Gospel story because it speaks to what is happening in our country. There is no question that our nation is in desperate need of Jesus. Whether it be political upheaval, the loneliness and loss that came from COVID and many other causes have increased a deep longing within people. Most people tried to fill that void with worldly things, but that has left people feeling more alone, with greater anxiety and increasing feelings of despair. The mental health crisis in our country only grows greater, exacerbated by the surrounding circumstances of the past couple of years. With that, there has been a growing longing for wholeness and healing within our country within all generations.

The Transfiguration reminds us that religious experiences are real and God wants to impact our lives in ways that we can't even imagine. This is evident in Asbury and the remarkable attendance nationwide to see the Jesus Revolution movie. But similar to the Transfiguration story, Jesus calls us down from the mountain to then share that with other people, "Come see Jesus who changed my life and he can change yours too." Many of us have beautiful religious experiences that have formed us and have confirmed belief in God.

In recent years, we have been plagued by the collective sense that faith is only meant to remain in the personal sphere. God has been pushed out of our schools, our political sphere and slowly out of family life. I pray that this period of revival in our country will embolden people to share their faith because the alternative is not working. We desperately need Jesus; we need these Transfiguration and revival moments in our lives to spark the gift of the Holy Spirit within us and to stir our souls to love as God does. But to make this happen we first need to climb the mountain; we need to take the first step. A few suggestions for those first few steps, go to Adoration (every Wednesday at St. James), go to Confession and clean your soul, increase a longing for the mystery of Jesus in the Eucharist and receiving him at Mass, pray together as a family, don't be afraid of sharing Jesus with others. Lord let revival take place in our hearts! Bring the fire of your Holy Spirit!

In re The Diocese of Buffalo, N.Y., Case No. 20-10322

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT, On February 28, 2020, The Diocese of Buffalo, N.Y ("Diocese") files for protection under chapter 11 of title 11 of the United States Code (the "Bankruptcy Code").

The Court entered an Order (the "Supplemental Bar Date Order") setting April 17, 2023 at 11:59 P.M. (prevailing Eastern Time) (the "Supplemental Bar Date") as the deadline to assert claims against the Diocese arising from or relating to abuse that occurred when the survivor was 18 years of age of older, and which, prior to the enactment of the Adult Survivors Act (S.66A/A.648A) would have been subject to a statute of limitations defense ("Adult Claims").

If you have an Adult Claim against the Diocese you must file a claim on or before the Supplemental Bar Date.
