St. James Parish — Second Sunday of Lent

From the desk of Fr. Paul Cygan

Lent; Quadragesima; Cuaresma; Quaresima; Wielki Post; Fastenzeit.

All of these are different ways of saying Lent in different languages. In order these languages are English, Latin, Spanish, Italian, Polish and German.

As you can see three of these are very similar to each other and the others are somewhat related. Each of these words expresses something about what happens during this season of penitence. "Lent" comes from the Old English language meaning springtime. It expresses the most hopeful meaning of them all that we are called to renew ourselves in our relationship with Christ and allow for a springtime of growth to start within our souls.

Quadregesima, Cuaresma and Quaresima, simply refer to the length of Lent, being forty days. There is a strong precedent in Scripture for the importance of the number forty whether it be the Noahic flood lasting forty days, Moses and the Israelite people wandering the desert for forty years, and Jesus fasting in the desert for forty days and nights before he began his public ministry. In all of these Scriptural events we see a model for us of renewal and direction towards a new life in God.

Now, the last two *Wielki Post* and *Fastenzeit* are the most literal of all the translations. The first means the Great Fast and the second means a period of fasting. Fasting is an important part of Lent and I suppose it can have two meanings. Fasting can refer generally to the act of giving up certain foods or other pleasures for a spiritual gain or it can have the more specific definition of having three meals in the day; two small meals that when added together do not make up the sum of the larger meal. When the Church requests that we fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, she is asking that we do the latter, two small meals and one larger one. It goes without saying that large meal does not mean a sumptuous feast! According to the USCCB, fasting is obligatory for those 18-59 years of age and abstaining from meat is obligatory from ages 14 onward. This obligation is exempted for those who are ill or have some other necessity.

Just by seeing the variety of names for Lent in different languages shows how this beautiful season is multifaceted. I believe that these three forms are the most common names you will see whether Lent is referred to as a springtime, forty days or a great fast. May all of these expressions of Lent be a reminder how we are all to turn closer to God during this season.

United States Bankruptcy Court For the Western District of New York In re The Diocese of Buffalo, N.Y., Case No. 20-10322

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT, On February 28, 2020, The Diocese of Buffalo, N.Y ("Diocese") files for protection under chapter 11 of title 11 of the United States Code (the "Bankruptcy Code").

The Court entered an Order (the "Supplemental Bar Date Order") setting April 17, 2023 at 11:59 P.M. (prevailing Eastern Time) (the "Supplemental Bar Date") as the deadline to assert claims against the Diocese arising from or relating to abuse that occurred when the survivor was 18 years of age of older, and which, prior to the enactment of the Adult Survivors Act (S.66A/A.648A) would have been subject to a statute of limitations defense ("Adult Claims").

If you have an Adult Claim against the Diocese you must file a claim on or before the Supplemental Bar Date.
