St. James Parish — The Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

This Monday, we celebrate the memorial of Pope Saint Pius X, the Pope of the Eucharist. Why does he have this title? Prior to Pope Pius' papacy, it was common practice among the Catholic faithful to limit the receiving of the Holy Eucharist to only once a year. Very few Catholics would receive weekly and typically, only priests would receive daily. Pope Saint Pius X saw this dilemma and encouraged the faithful to frequent reception of Communion stressing the spiritual benefits of doing so. He reiterated the tenets from the Council of Trent (at that point already 400 years past) that the Eucharist is an "antidote whereby we may be freed from daily faults and be preserved from mortal sins." In addition, Pope Pius looked to a more recent decree from the Sacred Congregation of the Council in 1905 which declared that "daily approach to Communion is open to all, old and young, and two conditions only are required: the state of grace and a right intention." In encouraging more frequent reception of the Holy Eucharist, Pope Pius was attempting to enable faithful Catholics to make a habit of taking part in the sacramental grace that comes from receiving Communion.

While this was a highlight of Pope Pius' papal career, he is actually most well-known for lowering the minimum age to receive the Eucharist from twelve years old to the "age of reason" which is typically around seven years old. He saw that children have a unique innocence and closeness to God and deserve to receive Christ's body and blood in this happy state of innocence and purity of soul.

A hundred plus years later as we reflect on Pope Saint Pius and his Eucharistic revival, we also look forward to our own national Eucharistic Revival. As you know, a couple months ago we took part in our Family of Parishes' Life in the Eucharist series where we unpacked the beauty of Christ's presence in the Eucharist. Now on a national scale, the US bishops are inviting all Catholics to take part in the Eucharistic Revival Congress taking place next summer on July 17-21 in Indianapolis. This will be a beautiful opportunity for renewal and growth as the Church in the US.

What are our Eucharistic dilemmas that we face in our time right now? They are certainly different from what Pope Saint Pius X faced over a century ago. A fairly recent study on Catholics in the US (Pew research 2019) showed that only a third of Catholics believe in transubstantiation and rather believe that the Eucharist is primarily symbolic. In addition, many Catholics do not have any moral qualms about receiving the Eucharist with knowledge of mortal sin on their souls without first going to Confession.

While the dilemmas may be different, the answer remains the same. Pope Saint Pius X reminds us that that the answer is found in frequent reception of the Eucharist in the state of grace (without stain of mortal sin) and with the right intention (reverence towards and knowledge of Christ's true presence in the Eucharist). Let us pray together through the intercession of Pope Saint Pius X that Catholics all over the world may draw closer to the source and summit of our faith, Jesus Christ, present Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity in the Eucharist.
